# **GENERAL INFO:**

We've got a TON to accomplish during rehearsals this week. Remember, everyone should be off-book for Act 1 tomorrow and off-book for Act 2 on Friday. Many students with speaking roles in shows over the years have often asked, "Mr. Greene, how can I really upset and disappoint you with regards to being off-book for my part." To this question I've always responded, "Student, this question doesn't really seem like it's ever actually been asked of me before. It seems much more likely that I simply want to prove a point about the necessity for getting off-book early in the rehearsal process. Why don't I simply remove the artificiality of quoting past students who never asked this question and address it directly." Students generally responded to this response by saying, "I'm really lost right now. If neither I nor my peers have ever actually asked you this before, why are you continuing to quote us?"
